To: Washington State Patrol

Recently a motorcycle organization I belong to printed what statutes apply to motorcycles pulling a trailer. One item covered the speed limit for vehicles in combination. This means if we pull a trailer we must adhere to the truck speed limit. Sgt Steve Fretts of the Hoquiam Police Department reported that your office stated that RCW 46.61.410 (2) & (3) pertains to trucks and trucks in combination only. Is this correct?

### RCW 46.61.410

## Increases by secretary of transportation — Maximum speed limit for trucks — Auto stages — Signs and notices.

(2) The maximum speed limit for vehicles over ten thousand pounds gross weight and vehicles in combination **except auto stages** shall not exceed sixty miles per hour and may be established at a lower limit by the secretary as provided in RCW [46.61.405](#). (this statute deals with all vehicle/s and auto stages)

(3) The word "trucks" used by the department on signs giving notice of maximum speed limits means vehicles over ten thousand pounds gross weight and all vehicles in combination except auto stages. **According to the WSP Equipment and Standards division out of Olympia, the word and in section 2 of RCW 46.61.410 states trucks and vehicles in combination. This means a truck over 10,000 and in combination. I know, strange way to put it, but I heard this from the source. Anyone who is still unsure is encouraged to call this division and they will be happy to explain it. Quote from Steve Fretts.**

My concern is that the definition under 46.04.130 of combination of vehicles is:

"Combination of vehicles" means every combination of motor vehicle and motor vehicle, motor vehicle and trailer or motor vehicle and semitrailer. And

The definition of " Motor Vehicle" under 46.04.320 (changed in 2007) is:

" Motor Vehicle" means every vehicle that is self-propelled and every vehicle that is propelled by electric power obtained from overhead trolley wires, but not operated upon rails. " Motor Vehicle" includes a neighborhood electric vehicle as defined in RCW 46.04.357. An Electric personal assistive mobility device is not considered a motor vehicle. A power wheelchair is not considered a motor vehicle, and

The definition of Vehicle under RCW 46.61.670 is:

" Vehicle" includes every device capable of being moved upon a public highway and in, upon, or by which any persons or property is or may be transported or drawn upon a public highway, including bicycles. The term does not include a power wheelchair or devices other than bicycles moved by human or animal power or used exclusively upon stationary rails or tracks. Mopeds shall not be considered a vehicle or motor vehicles for the purposes of chapter 46.70 RCW. Bicycles shall not be considered vehicles for the purposes of chapter 46.12 or 46.70 RCW. Electric personal assistive mobility devices are not considered vehicles or motor vehicles for the purposes of 46.12, 46.16, 46.29, 46.37, or 46.70 RCW.

I provide many talks to the trucking industry for large as well as small businesses. Many of the small businesses, their trucks and trailers combinations do

not meet the 10,000 pound limit. I would like to be providing the most accurate information available. I have asked many line troopers this week and they all say the same thing, the truck speed applies to any **vehicle** in combination.

Reference the e-mail above... the answer to your question is, ALL vehicles in combination must comply with the truck speed limit.

The law states (2) The maximum speed limit for vehicles over ten thousand pounds gross weight and vehicles in combination

Because the word AND is used in the language... vehicles in combination that are under the 10,000 pound gross weight are also subject to the speed limit.

Hopefully this answers your question. If you need additional information or clarification, please let me know.

Over the past few months, Several e-mails and letters have circulated regarding traffic laws and who could do what on the hiways in WA state. Recently several people have contacted me in an effort to put these letters to rest and let everyone know what the truth is regarding the laws surrounding these letters and e-mails.

First, lets talk about a recent e-mail concerning different traffic laws and the costs. Here is both what was reported and what is the truth. I took all my research from the WA RCW's as well as the court penalty schedule.

*From the WSP web site*

#### **How does the State Patrol set fines for speeding and other traffic violations?**

The Washington State Patrol does not set fines for speeding and traffic violations. The base penalty is set by the Washington State Supreme Court ([RCW 46.63.110](#)) but does not include statutory assessments, which are set by the State Legislature.

The [Monetary Penalty Schedule for Infractions](#) (effective July 1, 2007) can be viewed from the [Washington Courts website](#).

**\*Special Note:** As of July 5, 2007 there is an e-mail circulating the internet with the subject " New Traffic Fines For 2007" or a variation thereof is **not valid** for Washington State. The above link for Monetary Penalty Schedule will take you to the actual Washington Monetary Fines for traffic violations.\*

**. What is the fine for failure to or improperly use or wear a seat belt or child safety restraint device?**  
The fine is \$112.

#### **Can I be issued a (Notice of Infraction) ticket for no seat belt if a person in my car is over 16?**

No. The driver of a vehicle is only responsible for ensuring all persons 15 and under are properly secured in a seat belt or other safety restraint device as required by law. All persons age 16 and over may be issued a separate Notice of Infraction.

*Now to address a problem which at face value makes sense. You have to read further into the statute to find how the law applies to motorcycles.*

*First, a motorcycle is defined as up to three wheels on the ground. See Below.*

#### **RCW 46.04.330 Motorcycle.**

"Motorcycle" means a motor vehicle designed to travel on not more **than three wheels** in contact with the ground, on which the driver rides astride the motor unit or power train and is designed to be steered with a handle bar, but excluding a farm tractor, a power wheelchair, an electric personal assistive mobility device, and a moped.

The Washington state patrol may approve of

and define as a "motorcycle" a motor vehicle that fails to meet these specific criteria, but that is essentially similar in performance and application to motor vehicles that do meet these specific criteria.

*Next, we see who can use the HOV lanes. Motorcycles are allowed.*

#### **Who is authorized to use HOV lanes?**

1) Rubber tired municipal transit vehicles conforming to [RCW 46.04.355](#) ; 2) Buses with a capacity of sixteen or more, including operator; 3) Motorcycles conforming to [RCW 46.04.330](#) ; 4) Recreational vehicles with the number of occupants specified on signs; 5) Other vehicles with the number of occupants specified on signs (See [RCW 46.61.165](#) and [47.52.025](#) ). All trucks exceeding 10,000 lb. G.V.W. are prohibited from using HOV lanes at any time, except for tow trucks en route to an emergency on a specific roadway or roadside.

*Now the statutes get a little fuzzy. They tell you that trucks and vehicles in combination have to obey the truck speed limits. If you read section 2 the truck must be 10,000 or over for that to apply. In section 3 talks about any vehicle in combination. Sounds pretty clear that even a motorcycle would have to obey the truck speed. Not so, read on...*

#### **RCW 46.61.410**

### **Increases by secretary of transportation — Maximum speed limit for trucks — Auto stages — Signs and notices.**

(2) The maximum speed limit for vehicles over ten thousand pounds gross weight and vehicles in combination except auto stages shall not exceed sixty miles per hour and may be established at a lower limit by the secretary as provided in [RCW 46.61.405](#).

(3) The word "trucks" used by the department on signs giving notice of maximum speed limits means vehicles over ten thousand pounds gross weight and all vehicles in combination except auto stages. **According to the WSP Equipment and Standards division out of Olympia, the word and in section 2 of RCW 46.61.410 states trucks and vehicles in combination. This means a truck over 10,000 and in**

**combination. I know, strange way to put it, but I heard this from the source. Anyone who is still unsure is encouraged to call this division and they will be happy to explain it.**

#### **RCW 46.44.037**

### **Combination of units — Lawful operations.**

Notwithstanding the provisions of [RCW 46.44.036](#) and subject to such rules and regulations governing their operation as may be adopted by the state department of transportation, operation of the following combinations is lawful:

(1) A combination consisting of a truck tractor, a semitrailer, and another semitrailer or a full trailer. In this combination a converter gear used to convert a semitrailer into a full trailer shall be considered to be a part of the full trailer and not a separate vehicle. A converter gear being pulled without load and not used to convert a semitrailer into a full trailer may be substituted in lieu of a full trailer or a semitrailer in any lawful combination;

(2) A combination not exceeding seventy-five feet in overall length consisting of four trucks or truck tractors used in driveaway service where three of the vehicles are towed by the fourth in triple saddlemount position;

(3) A combination consisting of a truck tractor carrying a freight compartment no longer than eight feet, a semitrailer, and another semitrailer or full trailer that meets the

legal length requirement for a truck and trailer combination set forth in RCW [46.44.030](#).

## **RCW 46.04.130**

### **Combination of vehicles.**

"Combination of vehicles" means every combination of motor vehicle and motor vehicle, motor vehicle and trailer or motor vehicle and semitrailer.

There ya have it. Hope this clears up the rumors

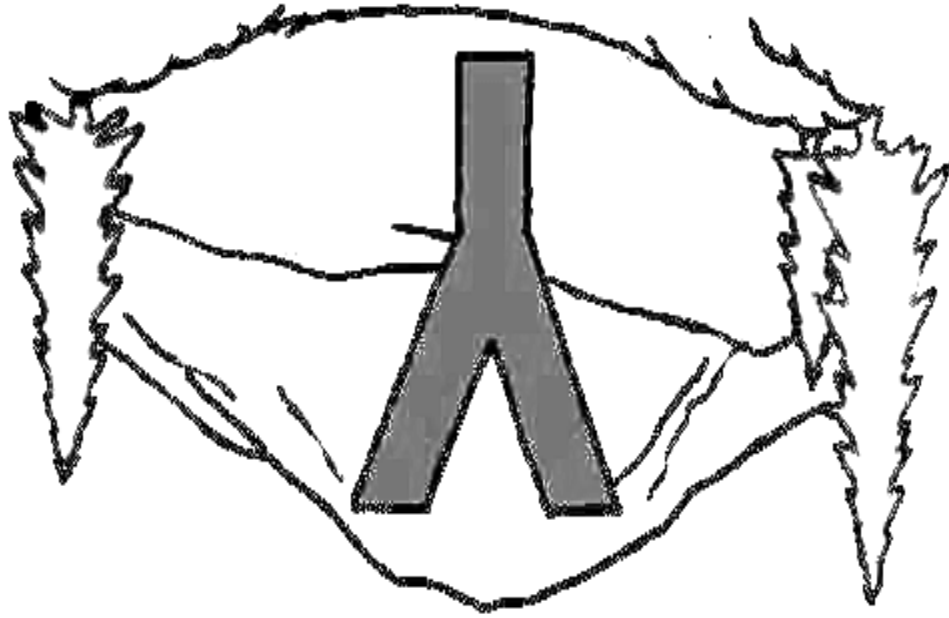
